This academic year was especially memorable as we celebrated the 20th Commencement Ceremony, a proud milestone that reflects two decades of shaping future leaders and empowering students to succeed.

One of the most significant accomplishments of the year came in December 2024, when UCB signed a Memorandum of Agreement with the Hashemite University in Jordan, opening doors for future academic collaboration and joint research opportunities.

In May 2025, UCB received a Confidence Rating from the Bahrain Education & Training Quality Authority (BQA) for the Communication and Multimedia Department, and an Adequate Progress Rating for the Information Technology Department. In June 2025, UCB was granted a license by the Board of Trustees of the Higher Education Council to launch a new postgraduate program – the Master of Arts in Digital Media and Communication.

In July 2025, UCB achieved a major milestone by receiving international accreditation from the UK's Quality Assurance Agency for Higher Education (QAA). This included both the Institutional Quality Review (IQR) and the International Programme Accreditation (IPA) for its MBA program. This recognition reflects UCB's unwavering commitment to academic excellence and its alignment with internationally benchmarked standards. By attaining this prestigious accreditation, UCB joins a distinguished group of globally recognized higher education institutions accredited by QAA.

In September 2025, UCB received further approval from the Higher Education Council to launch another new master's program – the Master of Science in Information Technology (Cybersecurity).

Additionally, UCB became a proud member of Advance HE, further demonstrating its commitment to continuous academic and professional development within higher education. As part of this commitment, the majority of the faculty members at UCB achieved Advance HE Fellowship status across various categories – including Principal Fellow, Senior Fellow, and Fellow – a remarkable milestone that reflects their dedication to teaching excellence, leadership, and innovation in higher education.

We are also proud to share that in July 2025, the World Health Organization (WHO) officially recognized UCB as a “Healthy University” – a reflection of our commitment to well-being and health promotion. The certificate will be formally awarded at the beginning of the upcoming academic year.

This academic year also marked the launch of UCB's new five-year strategic plan (2025–2030), developed with valuable input from key stakeholders and formally approved by the Board of Trustees. Anchored by six strategic goals, this forward-looking plan will guide the University's priorities and initiatives over the coming years. It sets forth a bold and ambitious vision for UCB's future – one that emphasizes innovation, academic excellence, and meaningful impact across teaching, research, and community engagement.

In the academic year 2024–2025, we expanded our financial support programs for newly admitted students – a clear reflection of our continued commitment to making higher education accessible to all eligible learners, regardless of their financial circumstances. This initiative underscores UCB's dedication to promoting inclusivity and equal opportunity, ensuring that financial limitations do not stand in the way of talented and deserving students as they pursue their academic and professional aspirations.

Throughout the year, we organized over 50 workshops, social events, and sports activities, each thoughtfully designed to promote personal growth, collaboration, and well-being. The Student Affairs and Alumni Office, along with the Community Engagement Unit, remained fully committed to fostering a student-centered environment focused on holistic development. These initiatives brought together students, faculty, alumni, and external partners, cultivating a strong sense of community and belonging. They also enriched the student experience, ensuring a well-rounded education that extended far beyond the classroom.

Among the most notable events were the 3rd Entrepreneurship Day, Career Day, Research Day, the Communication and Multimedia Exhibition (CMM Exhibition), club activities, field trips, and celebrations of both the Saudi and Bahrain National Days. A cornerstone of UCB's mission is to be a university without borders – one that is deeply committed to serving and engaging with the wider community. In alignment with this mission, the Community Engagement Unit organized a number of impactful awareness campaigns throughout the academic year, addressing key social issues and promoting civic responsibility among students.

In line with UCB’s strategic goal of strengthening research, the University successfully organized its 2nd International Conference in April 2025, titled Sustainable Business Future: Innovating for a Greener Tomorrow (ICBIT). In parallel, UCB’s research output – measured by peer-reviewed journal publications and conference proceedings – increased by over 50% compared to the previous academic year, reflecting the growing research culture and academic engagement within the University. As part of our ongoing efforts to stay ahead in an ever-evolving digital landscape, UCB has made significant upgrades to its digital infrastructure. In addition, our classrooms have been equipped with Smart Boards, enhancing the teaching and learning experience through interactive technology. 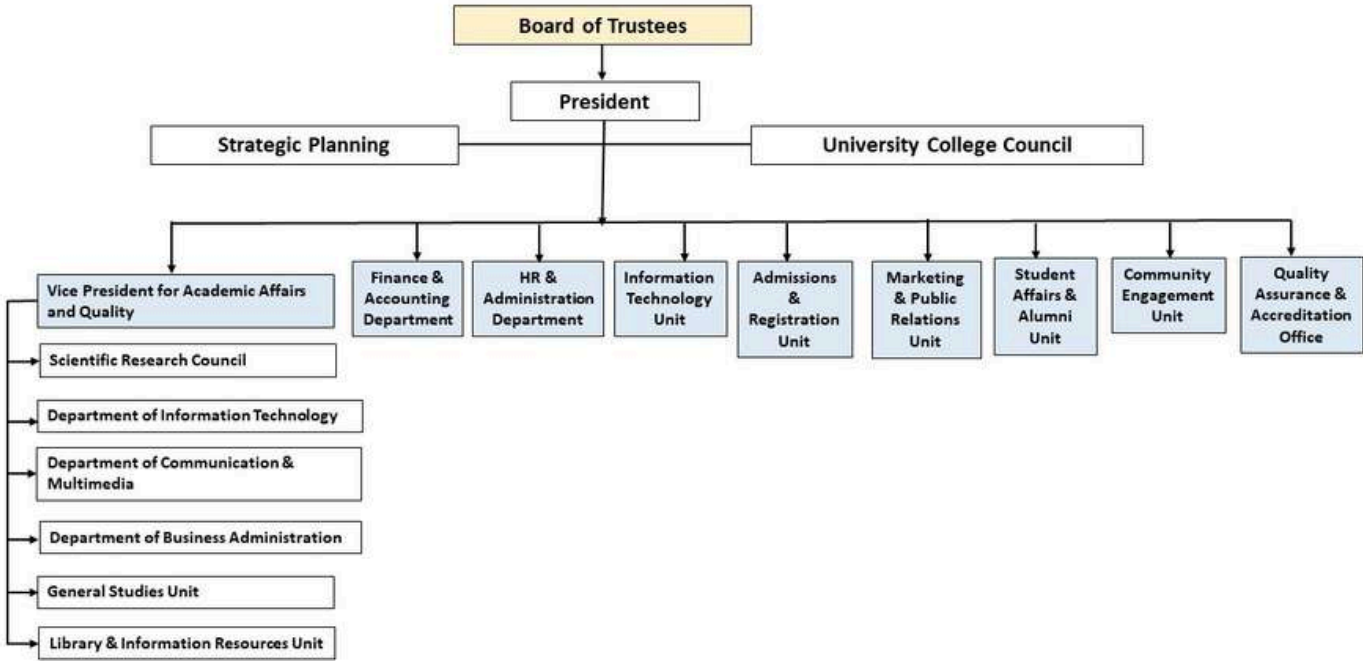

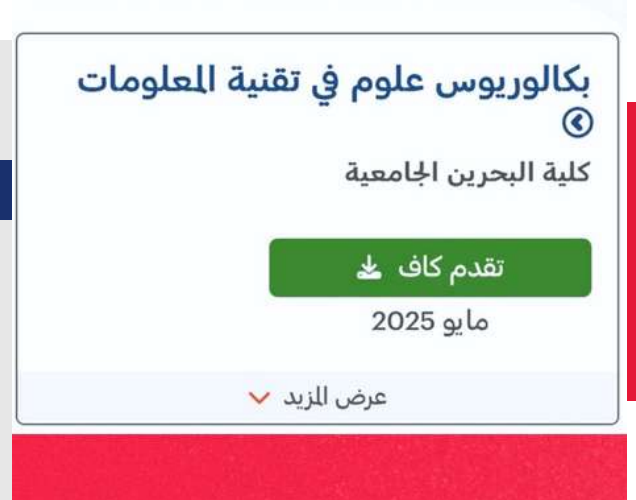
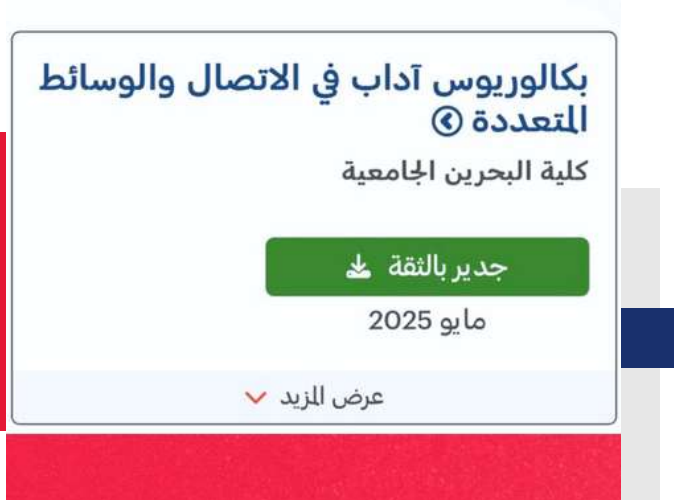

EXPANDING ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE



A- University College of Bahrain and the Hashemite University in Jordan Sign a Memorandum Agreement to Strengthen Academic and Research Partnership. In line with efforts to enhance academic and research collaboration, University College of Bahrain and the Hashemite University, Jordan signed a memorandum agreement. The agreement was signed on behalf of University College of Bahrain by Dr. Rana Sawaya, President of the University, and on behalf of the Hashemite University by Prof. Dr. Wasfi Al-Zwaida, Vice President acting on behalf of the University President. In addition, the university librarian provided an informative session on how to use the library's digital catalog system, understand the book rental policy, and access both print and electronic resources.

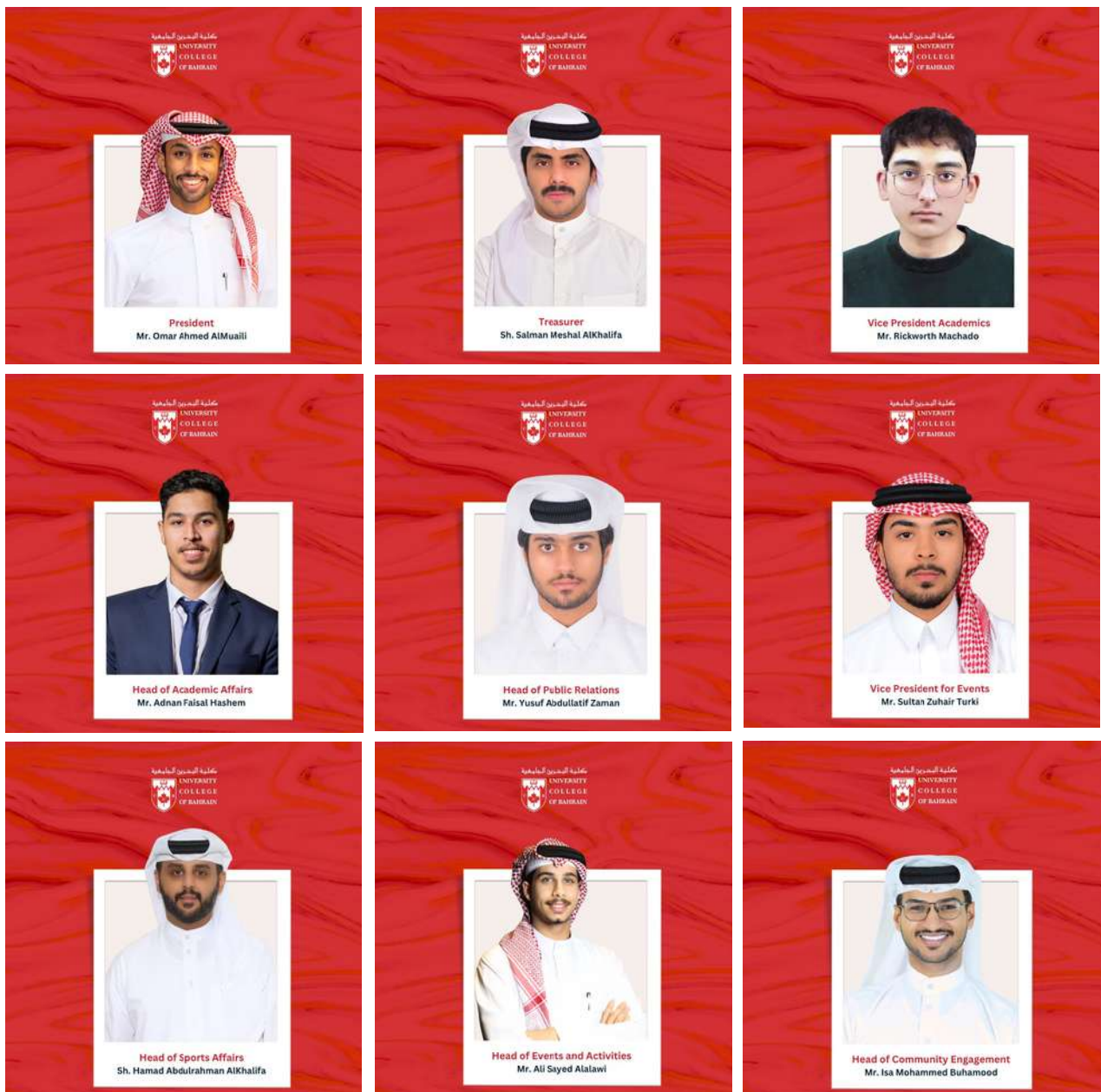

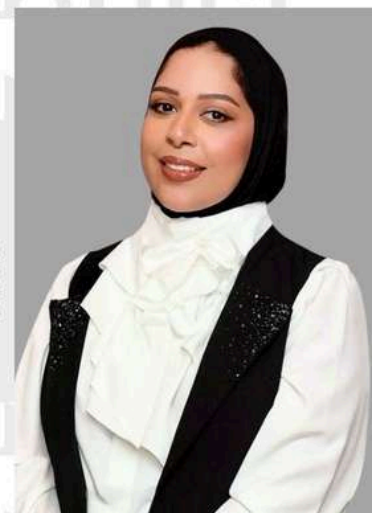
UCB Student Selected for National Youth Leadership Program

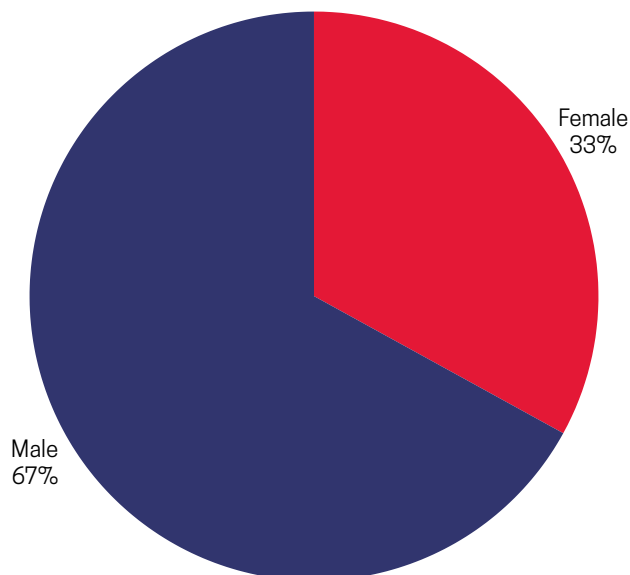
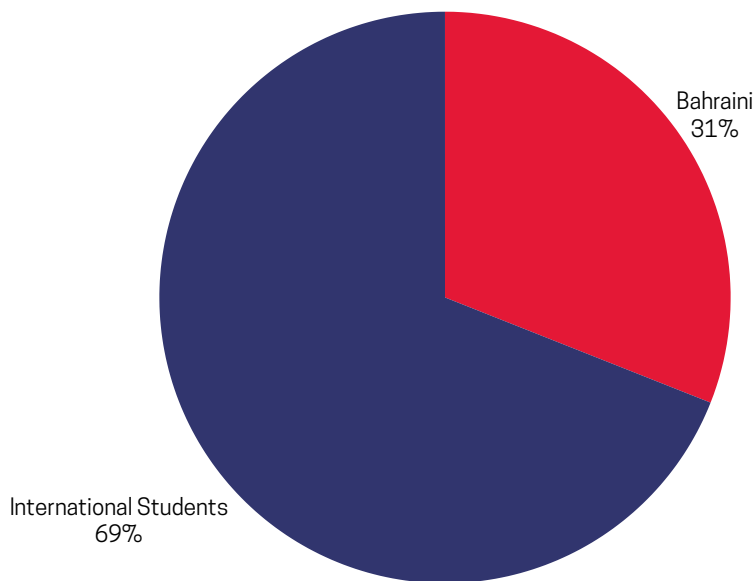

RESEARCH EXCELLENCE

At the University College of Bahrain (UCB), we are deeply committed to promoting high-quality and ethically grounded research, in alignment with the Kingdom of Bahrain's Vision 2030 and the National Research Strategy. Our research agenda is fully integrated with UCB's strategic objectives, ensuring that scholarly activities contribute meaningfully to social, business, economic, technological, and sustainability.

The academic year 2024–2025 marked a significant milestone in UCB's research journey. We proudly hosted the 2nd UCB International Conference on Business and Innovative Technology (UCB-ICBIT 2025) in May 2025. The conference received an overwhelming response, with 233 scientific papers submitted and 111 papers accepted from 36 countries. UCB faculty members, students, and alumni actively participated as presenters, reflecting our mission to nurture a research culture across all academic levels.

Equally notable was the success of the 2nd UCB Research Day in April 2025, which showcased undergraduate student poster presentations, a research dialogue on Artificial Intelligence, and the Three-Minute Thesis (3MT) competition for MBA students. These initiatives demonstrated UCB's commitment to building a vibrant and inclusive research ecosystem that bridges theory with practice.

In collaboration with the Community Engagement Committee, the university also organized capacity-building workshops on questionnaire design and development for faculty, students, and external stakeholders, further strengthening research mentorship and skills development.

UCB's research output continued to grow remarkably in AY 2024–25. Faculty produced 97 major scholarly publications, a significant increase from 43 publications in AY 2023–24. This includes 21 journal articles, 28 book chapters, 5 books, and 43 conference papers. This upward trend highlights the dedication, innovation, and perseverance of our faculty and students, reinforcing UCB's role as a leading institution fostering research excellence and societal impact.

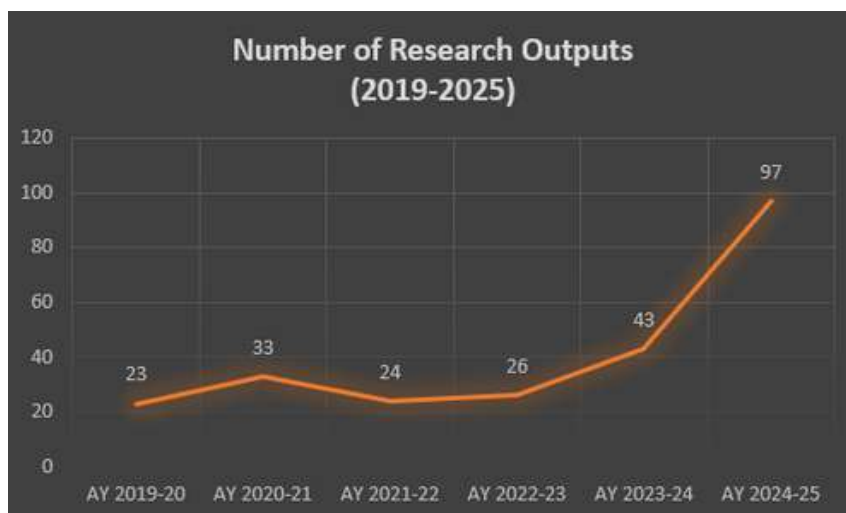

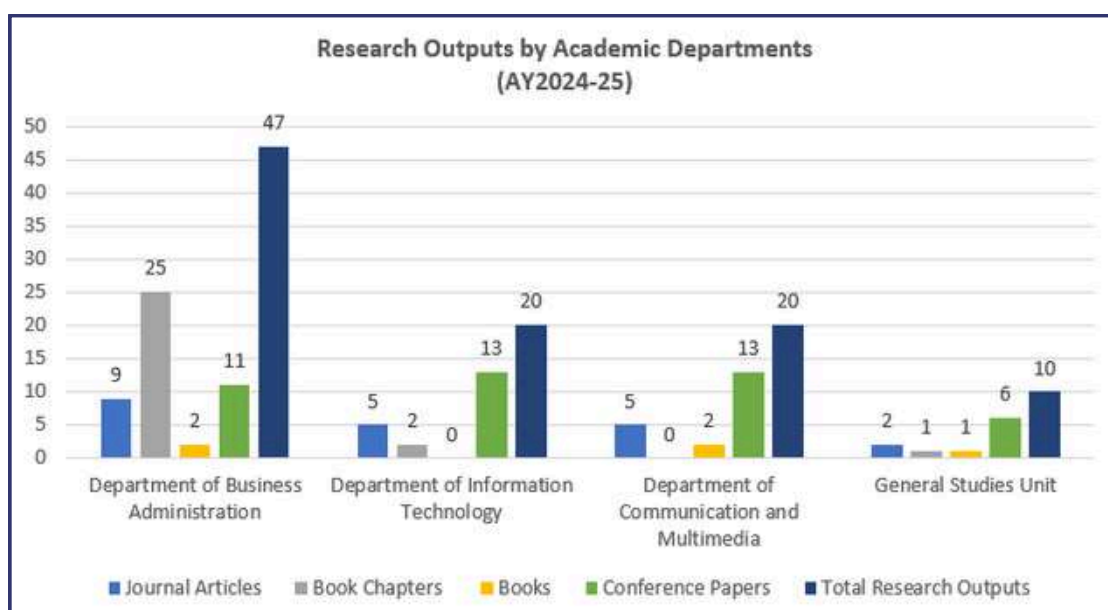

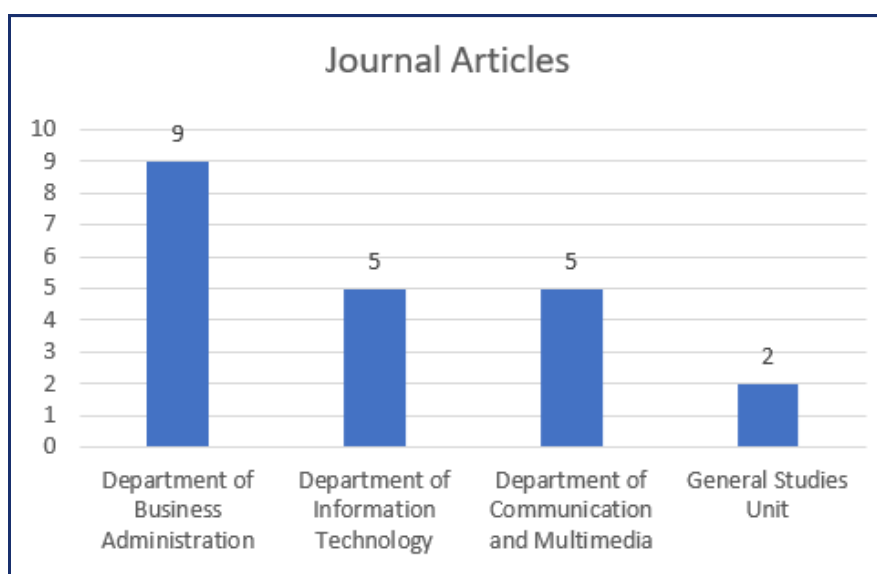

Published journal articles in AY 2024 - 2025

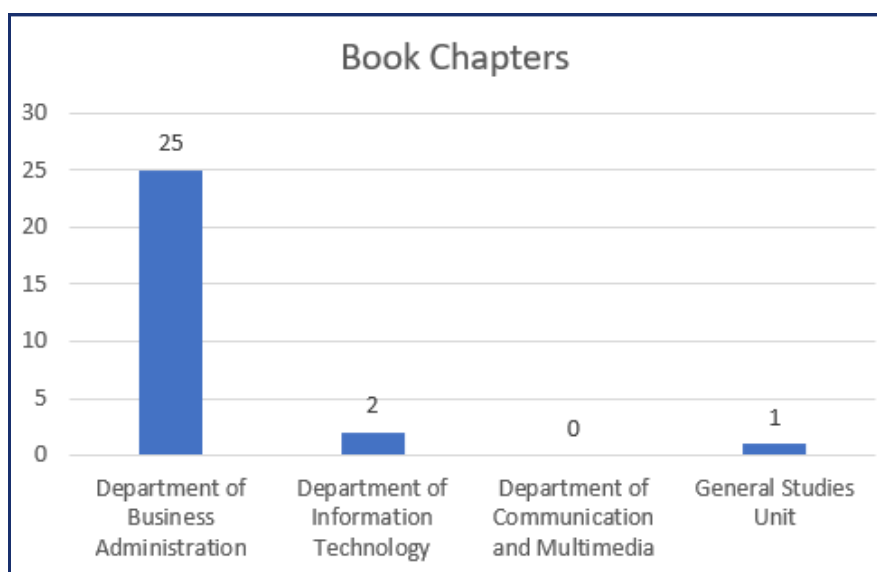

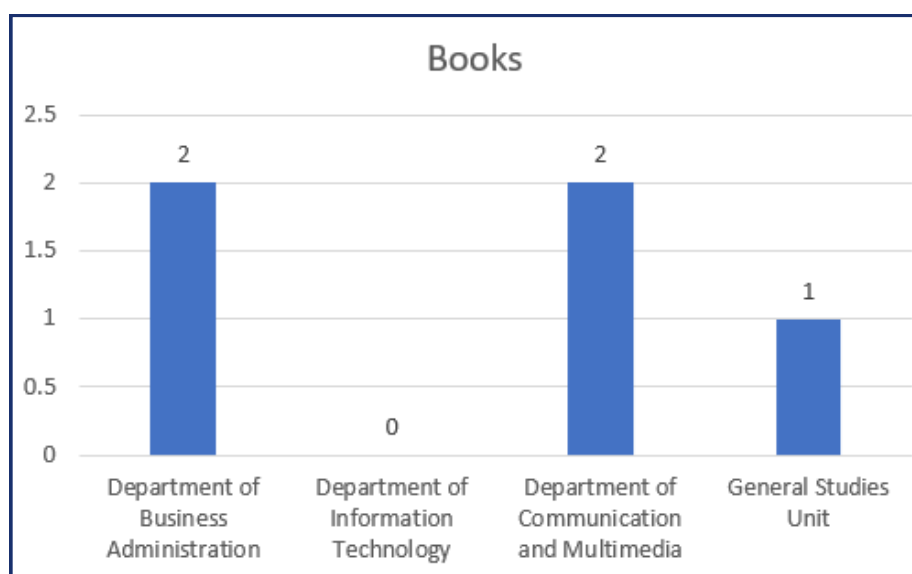

Published books in AY 2024 - 2025

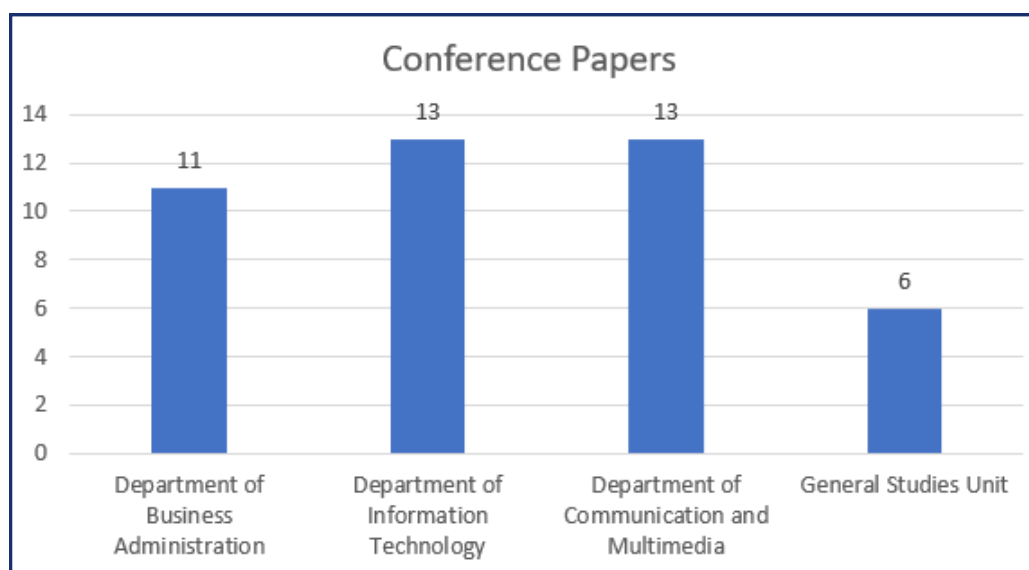

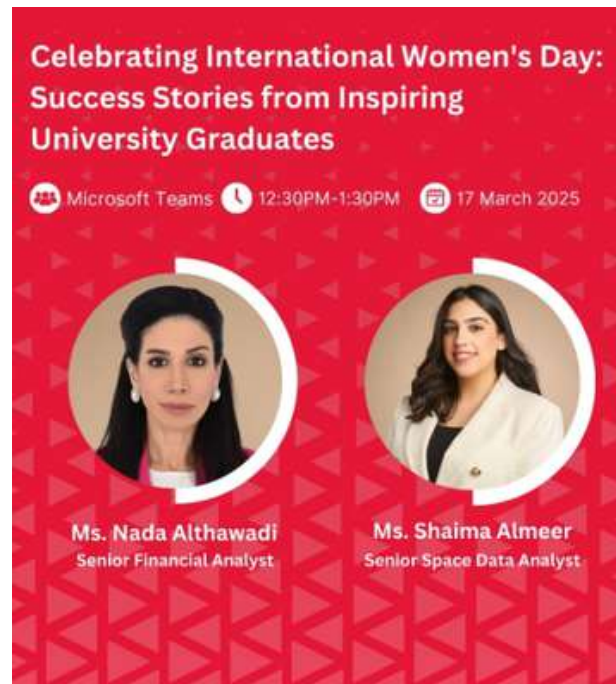
